Dear Residents,

Welcome to our January newsletter.



We hope you all had a great Christmas and enjoyed the New Year celebrations.

Looking back at December, we had a range of activities for the festive season.

In our craft sessions the Residents made wreaths for their room doors, which they did from a bare metal frame by adding a layer of moss and then the flowers and foliage, with some excellent results.



On 10<sup>th</sup> December we were invited to Send First School to watch the dress rehearsal of their Nativity Play. Several Residents were able to go along and watch the show, with lots of children in colourful costumes as sheep, shepherds, wise men and, of course, Mary and Joseph.

On 11<sup>th</sup> December we were very fortunate to be given a "Victorian Christmas Concert" by Sally-Ann Shepherdson and Trevor Alexander, accompanied on the piano by Sally-Ann's husband Peter Robinson. Sally-Ann, a soprano, has worked with many national opera companies both in the UK and Europe, as well as singing as a guest artist with a number of cruise lines, including P&O and MSC Cruises. She has also performed with José Carreras in Paris and London. Trevor, a baritone, has worked with a range of prominent opera companies and also with the RSC. He too has performed around the world with P&O as well as playing a range of parts in numerous opera productions.

Peter studied music at Oxford and was Chorus Master at Glyndebourne, followed by several years as Resident Conductor and Head of Music Staff for the Australian Opera at Sydney Opera house. He has also worked as the Assistant Music Director at the ENO.

As you can imagine, with this level of talent and experience, we were treated to an excellent concert where we enjoyed some opera pieces, readings, light hearted Christmas songs and we were also able to sing along to some traditional carols. It was a wonderful afternoon and we are very grateful to Sally-Ann for arranging and performing the concert.





The next day we had our first "Christmas Lights" outing. On this occasion we drove out through Ripley and up to West Horsley before coming back toward The Old Hall through Clandon. We finished the tour in the Send Marsh estate, where one particular cul-de-sac all put on a Christmas Light extravaganza, which created an excellent spectacle.

Our festivities continued on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> with a lunchtime visit from the Send First School Choir. We packed 32 children into the dining rooms to sing to the Residents while they enjoyed their lunch, and the children performed very well and very enthusiastically!



In the afternoon we welcomed back The Carousel Theatre Company who performed our Christmas pantomime. This year is was Jack and the Beanstalk starring Daisy the Cow. We had a great afternoon with the required booing, hissing and "Behind you" – it was a full pantomime performed by a cast of just three actors!





On Friday 14<sup>th</sup> we put up our real Christmas Tree. We had decorated the rest of the building during the week, so this was our final piece of festive colour.
